- Bear Right onto South Dixie Drive
- Turn Left onto Dryden Road
- Turn Left onto East River Road
- Arrive at 3040 East River Road on right just after the pond

ALL purebred and mixed breed dogs are welcome to attend our classes.

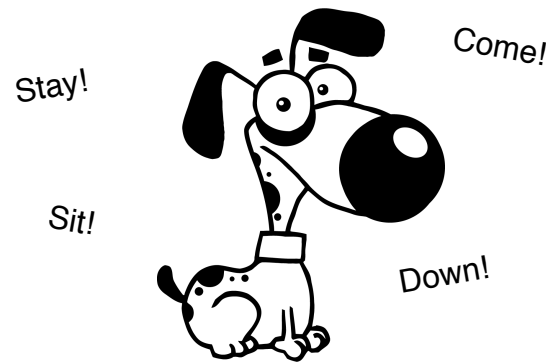
